

Authors are **strongly encouraged** to submit papers based on their presentations or related efforts to the seven (7) special journal issues associated with this meeting. Plenary speakers will receive separate guidance for their papers.

PUBLICATIONS POLICY

Submit tentative titles and authors with corresponding author's full contact information via email by **Monday, April 12, 2010 to Paul Solomon, (Solomon.paul@epa.gov).** This will allow the tracking of papers since you will be submitting papers directly to journals as well as notify you of extensions to the due date.

Papers must be submitted to journals no later than **May 17, 2010. Journals have indicated this will be a firm deadline.**

Submissions must adhere to all publication guidelines specified by each individual journal, including scope, goals, and authors guidelines, and each paper will strictly follow the rigorous review process of that journal. ***Journals that require authors to pay page charges (noted below) will be paid by the author, not the conference.*** We suggest you visit the website(s) of the journal(s) you wish to submit papers to and review the journal's guidelines. All journals require electronic submission. Please note in all cases that your paper is being submitted to the 2010 AAAR Air Pollution and Health Conference Special Issue. There may be a separate link to note this; it might need to be noted in the editors comment box, or in a letter to the editor.

In all cases, ***submit an electronic copy (PDF preferred) by email to Paul Solomon after submitting to the journal.*** Do NOT zip the files as the attachments will be stripped from the email by the EPA firewall.

Please include in the body of the e-mail to Paul Solomon a list of five potential reviewers and their complete contact information. Also include, in the body of your email: 1) the journal you are submitting the paper to, 2) the date submitted to the journal, and 3) full contact information for the author to which correspondence should be made. No need for rationale or other information besides the actual paper.

Seven journals have agreed to consider special issues consisting of high quality scientific original papers. Please review the scope and goals of a journal before submitting to ensure the chosen journal is appropriate for your article. The 7 journals available for conference publications are:

Aerosol Science and Technology (AAAR Journal) (AS&T). Submit via the web at [Manuscript Central](#) for AS&T. [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website. In step 5 of the manuscript submission process, answer "yes" to the question, "Is this manuscript a candidate for a special issue?" then select the March 2010 AAAR Air Pollution and Health from the pull-down menu. Follow instructions for authors for your submission. There are no page charges with AS&T, except for printed color figures.

Atmospheric Environment (AE). Submit via the web at [Elsevier](#) for AE. [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website. You can identify your paper with the special issue for the conference by clicking the icon labeled AAAR-APHC. There are no page charges to authors for AE unless the author requests colored figures in the print version. The editor asks the those

submitting to AE review the following document before considering AE as their journal of choice – [Scope and Subjects NOT in Scope](#).

Air Quality, Atmosphere and Health (AQAH). Submit via the web at [Springer](#) for AQAH. In the top left hand corner of the home page, click the link SUBMIT A MANUSCRIPT and follow the directions for submitting a manuscript. [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website on the right side of the page. Identify your paper as part of the special issue under article type, please select the following: "March 2010 AAAR Air Pollution and Health." There are no page charges to authors for AQAH, including color figures in the on-line version. A subsidy is required for color figures in the print version.

Environmental Health Perspectives (EHP). Submit via the web at [Manuscript Central](#) for EHP. [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website. A cover letter must accompany the manuscript and in addition to the required information the authors must also include a statement that the manuscript is part of the 2010 AAAR Air Pollution and Health Conference. EHP has page charges to authors of \$30 per accepted *manuscript page* (excluding the first three pages) plus additional fees for color figures.

Inhalation Toxicology (IT). Submit via the web at [Manuscript Central](#) for IT: [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website, part way down the page. In the Details and Comments page of the submission process, answer "yes" to the question, "Is this manuscript a candidate for a special issue?" Then enter "2010 AAAR Air Pollution and Health" in the space provided. There are no page charges to authors for IT unless the author requests colored figures in the print version. Online color figures are free.

Journal of Exposure Science and Environmental Epidemiology (JESEE). Submit via the web at [Manuscript Central](#) for JESEE. [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website. The cost of each printed page for published manuscripts is \$105. Other charges apply for open access (see guide to authors).

Journal of the Air & Waste Management Association (JAWMA). Submit via the web at [Rapid Review](#) for JAWMA. [Author instructions](#) are available on the journal website. You will need to create an account if you do not have one ([Create Account](#)). In tab 7 of the Rapid Review submittal form (Keywords) use the MS Type pull-down box at the top of that page, and select 'March 2010 Air Pollution and Health.' JAWMA has page charges to authors of \$79 for members and \$89 per page for nonmembers, plus production fees for any color figures.

DISCLAIMER

Special Issues in many journals are costly to the organizing group, in this case AAAR. If insufficient conference funds are available for one or more special issues the submitted papers will simply move into that journal's normal submission and review process and be published if accepted as individual papers. Listed page charges are subject to change.
